SCC Campaign Meets \$4.8 Million Goal

Thanks to the support of thousands of donors and supporters, Presbyterian Home for Children has successfully raised \$4.8 million through its Second Century of Caring Campaign.

Half of the funding goes to support the Home's endowment to ensure future financial security while the other half goes to support capital projects including the new Ray Campbell Independent Living Village.

Campaign highlights include:
*Expanding the Independent Living facility from a two-story apartment building housing 12

youth to a village concept that will initially house 16 young people with room to grow;

*Improving the campus with renovations, gym padding, a new playground and buses with a higher safety rating than vans used previously;

*Increasing the endowment from \$5.5 million to nearly \$8 million; and

*Increasing known planned gifts from eight to 25 with more

Top 10 Projects

1. **Maintain Grounds** - we have 90 acres and one maintenance person—he can always use a hand!
2. **Teachers** – piano, guitar, photography, crafts, etc.; commit 1 hour weekly for 6-week course.
3. **Skilled Craftsmen** – stonemasons to do rockwork.
4. **Tutors** – help children who are behind academically.
5. **Concrete Workers** – to donate and pour concrete.
6. **Gardener/Landscaper** – able to plant a garden or bed or help maintain a portion of landscape.
7. **Computer Repair / IT Specialist** – willing to help with information technology issues.
8. **Woodworker** – make frames, birdhouses and simple items.
9. **Plumber** – help with plumbing projects on an as needed basis.
10. **Mural Painter**

Fall Festival Raises Funds & Awareness

The weather was perfect and attendance was strong for PHFC's third annual Fall Festival in October 2007.

Donors contributed nearly 200 themed baskets and craft items for the silent auction, which raised more than \$6,000 to go toward the Home's Second Century of Caring Campaign.

Approximately 300 guests also enjoyed games, wagon rides provided by John Showalter, music, a bake sale and a hot dog sale put on by the Home's Youth Leadership Team. The funds they raised were set aside for YLT service projects.

The response from churches, businesses and individuals in support of the event were enthusiastic and heart-warming.

"The outpouring of support for this event really made an impact," said PHFC President Tom Campbell. "We know that with this kind of support, we can look forward to our ministry growing and flourishing in the future. We can never thank our supporters enough."

In 2008, the festival will once again support the Home's Every Day Fund, which provides for the daily needs of children in care.

Children Giving to Children

Among the many donations presented to Presbyterian Home over the past century, the most treasured will always be 13 cents.

In 1904 a little girl named Hazel Johnson gave the very first gift to support the ministry of PHFC. Today her original 13 pennies are securely stored at The Home--a treasure beyond compare. And those pennies are continuing to draw interest--of a sort. Other children are being inspired to give in similar fashion.

A preschool class of four-year-olds at Unity Presbyterian in Gastonia raised nearly \$77 in coins dropped in a jar. Bessemer City Middle School raised \$200, 13 pennies at a time. They donated a chocolate fountain to be used at special events along
