The Glass Foundation of Asheville, NC, has awarded Presbyterian Home for Children \$25,000 to help create a nature preserve on its 90-acre campus in Black Mountain, NC. The preserve is one of the capital projects included in the SCC campaign.

The nature preserve will be located across a stream below the administration building with a bridge taking hikers to an area currently in need of reclamation. PHFC has already started the process of making trails and two transformer poles have been donated to form the base of the bridge. Youth and visitors will have the opportunity to explore the area and learn about plants and wildlife habitats through a series of nature markers. Benches will make the area a relaxing place to unwind and reflect.

The Glass Foundation was founded in 2000 by Kenneth E. and Nancy J. Glass with the intention of helping the Western North Carolina region thrive as a whole community educationally, environmentally, economically, and culturally and offer a distinctive quality of life.

The specific mission of the foundation is to strive for improved environmental education and preservation, to shape the developmental and educational opportunities for children and youth, and aid in the preservation of historic sites.
